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

### **UN SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION**



### UNSCR 1540 – OP3(d) requires all States to:




- take and enforce effective measures to <u>establish</u> domestic controls to prevent the proliferation of <u>nuclear, chemical, or biological weapons and their means of delivery,</u> including by establishing appropriate controls over related materials and to this end shall
- ...establish, develop, review and maintain appropriate effective national export and trans-shipment controls over such items, including appropriate laws and regulations to control export, transit, trans-shipment and re-export..."

With the implementation of the STA 2010 since January 2011, Malaysia has met the requirement of having a comprehensive export control legal framework



### TRADE FACILITATION



### (1) STRATEGIC ITEMS LIST

### **Adopt EU Control list:**

- Commonly used list in the region i.e. Hong Kong,
   Singapore.
- Consolidated list of items from control regimes and conventions.
- The list is updated annually.

### The Strategic Trade (Strategic Items) 2011

In the process of being gazetted.

#### **Assistance in Product Classification:**

 Commodity expert is available within the Secretariat to advice, based on technical specifications provided.



### (2) EXEMPTION

### Regulation 25: STA Permit Exemption for Transit & Transhipment

- arrive in a FCZ or brought immediately into FCZ;
- remain in the FCZ; and
- not exceeding 30 days
   (95% of transit & transshipment of strategic items are exempted from applying for permits).

### **However, no exemption for:**

- North Korea, Iran, Congo, Ivoy Coast, Lebanon, Sudan,
   Afghanistan, Iraq, Liberia, Rwanda, Somalia, Eritrea and Libya.
- items in Schedule Three of the STA Regulations 2010 (e.g. military items, nuclear reactors, gas centrifuge plant, uranium, maraging steel, tungsten, molybdenum and toxic chemicals, human pathogens).



### (3) AMENDMENTS OF STR - Effective 01 Dec '11

Based on the feedback from business community the following amendments were undertaken:

- (a) <u>Additional provision</u> in Regulation 11 to allow applicants to apply bulk and multiple permit for transit;
- (b) New format for Form 5 (End-Use Statement) and Form 6 (Delivery Verification Statement) that are simplified and business friendly; and
- (c) <u>To exclude</u> <u>ECCN 5A2</u> (systems, equipments and components) and <u>5B2</u> (test, inspections and production equipment) from the Third Schedule.




### (4) INTERNAL COMPLIANCE PROGRAM (ICP)

- A set of procedures that have to be implemented within a company before an application for multipleuse or bulk permit is made.
- Ensures that the company has control procedures in place that are in compliance with the STA 2010 and associated Regulations.
- The controls can be done:
  - manually, or
  - electronically.



### (5) EASY SELF-DECLARATION

- 1 July 2011: compulsory product declaration field in the Customs declaration forms - strategic item or non-strategic item.
- If declared as strategic items, the system will prompt for the STA permit number.



## (6) <u>ePERMIT STA – ONLINE REGISTRATION/</u> PERMIT APPLICATION SYSTEM

- Web-based pre-registration
- Web-based system for the application and approval of permits
- Approved permits will be transmitted to Customs Information System for cross-reference purposes against Customs declaration
- Designed to meet the specific requirements of STA for the purposes of products monitoring and standard
- Creates a virtual community for key players in the trade supply chain - paper-less environment






### (7) CONTINOUS OUTREACH PROGRAMMES

- Since July 2010 nearly 160 outreach programmes have been held with over 4,000 participants from Trade / Industry Associations and companies.
- Besides the outreach programmes, the 'Meet the Client' sessions are held every month and number of participants who have attended these sessions number over a 1,000.
- These programmes and sessions will be on-going as we reach out to a wider scope of stakeholders in the industry as well as in the Government.

### **AUDIT EXERCISE**



A total of <u>103 companies</u> have been audited in the year of 2012 and 2013.

### Among the key findings:

- Records are not kept for easy retrieval
   Records need to be kept for at least <u>6 years</u> and easy to retrieve
- Improper collection and retention of end use statement (Form 5)
   All Form 5 need to be made available and kept before any shipment is made
- Too many multiple-use permits
   Defeat the purpose of having multiple-use permit;
   may want to consider consolidation



- Changes/resignation of authorised applicant
   New authorisation letter and digital signature token reformatting is required
- Level of awareness of export control within organisation
   The awareness should be extended to everyone within the organisation.
- Lack of training on export control
   Training to export control officer can be done internally
- Issuance of delivery verification statement (Form 6)
   All STA permit need to submit/keep Form 6.
  - single-use/special: 2 months after shipment
  - multiple/bulk: kept by co, submit upon request by the Authority

## GOOD REGULATORY PRACTICE – REGULATORY IMPACT ASSESSMENT (GRP-RIA) PROJECT

- To ensure the regulatory regime effectively support the country's aspirations to be a high income and progressive nation.
- Greater coherence among policy objectives in various ministries and agencies.
- Proposed Amendments to STA 2010:
  - Discretion to the Strategic Trade Controller to determine the requirement of the Form 5 (End-Use Statement) esp. in transit and transshipment cases;
  - Include a voluntary disclosure clause
  - Include administrative/compoundable penalties
  - Redefine brokering.





## **ISSUES AND CHALLENGES**



## □ Export of high tech goods very important to Malaysia's economy

- reluctant to block shipments without clear proof that they are destined for restricted purposes.

### ☐ It's new to us

- lack of expertise and experience esp. in ITT, brokering etc;
- difficult to enforce the law, e.g. control on transit and transshipment; and
- lack of commitment from Malaysian industry, need a change in mindset.



- □ Updating of Strategic Item List
  - Technical constraints and time consuming.
- STA does not sufficiently cover certain important areas such as proliferation financing
- Capacity of Malaysian companies esp SME in establishing internal control system





## ☐ The Challenge of balance, coordination and awareness:

- a delicate balance between security and economic interests;
- lack of awareness both public and private sector; and
- coordination with multiple agencies (licensing and enforcement) and other domestic laws.

# FACTORS FOR EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STA



- Inter-agency cooperation is vital and indispensable for effective implementation and enforcement of the STA.
- Formulate SOPs better coordination among agencies especially in investigation process and procedures.
- Working closely and continuous consultations with the industry.
- To use assistance available from various donor countries and UN organisations to build expertise.
- Outreach is a vital tool for industry awareness and compliance.



- Information technology should be utilised to the fullest. On-line registration, application for permits and approval is key to facilitating trade.
- Developing expertise among the implementing and enforcement agencies by capitalising on support and assistance available from the various sources.
- Continue cooperation with US, EU, Japan and Australia in implementing the Act.
